
Good Luck Mr. Fitz!

School Community Safety Order Scheme: Statutory Review

A report and recommendations from the statutory review of the School Community Safety Order Scheme are now available.

While the majority of parents and carers work well with schools to resolve concerns, sometimes there is harmful behaviour affecting our school staff and students. The scheme allows principals and other authorised persons in Victorian schools to make School Community Safety Orders to stop or limit parents, carers and other adults who behave in harmful, threatening or abusive ways towards people in the school community.




Whether you're helping out in the classroom, on excursions, Parent Club activities or at school camps, completing the **Volunteer Induction** is a must.

YPS Emergency Evacuation Drill

All schools must conduct emergency response exercises, also known as drills, at least once every term.

Drills are recommended to test the school's response to a specific hazard (for example, fire or intruder) that the school site may face, or test core response procedures such as:

- onsite or offsite evacuation
- •the shelter-in-place
- •locking down (or out).

A drill schedule must be included in the school's Emergency Management Plan.

Performing a range of drill types is highly recommended as this will best prepare schools for real emergencies.

Drills ensure that:

- •staff and students are familiar with emergency response procedures, including how to perform delegated roles
- •emergency response procedures, evacuation locations and pathways are practical and workable
- •problems that may arise are identified and schools take preparatory steps to mitigate them including staff training.

NEXT DRILL IS OFFSITE (Code Red) DOWTON PARK—TENNIS COURTS THURSDAY 23RD OCTOBER

The drill will take approximately 20 minutes to conduct. During this time, the office will be locked and unmanned as ALL staff and student at YPS will take part.

The ELC have been informed that this is happening and will not be taking part in this drill.

The Get Active Kids Voucher Program is now open!

Get in quick as applications will close 13 November or earlier if the budget allocation is fully exhausted.

If your family or child has a Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card, you may be eligible for up to \$200 to put towards the cost of your child's participation in sport and active recreation activities.

Important Dates:

Round 9 open to apply for a voucher or reimbursement: 10:00 am Wednesday, 15 October 2025 and will close 13 November or earlier if the budget allocation is fully exhausted.

Reimbursement expenditure dates: from 1 July 2025 to submission of application

Vouchers expiry date: Wednesday, 31 December 2025.

The Get Active Kids Voucher Program helps eligible families get their kids involved in organised sport and active recreation activities by providing financial support for the cost of membership and registration fees.

Eligible children may be able to receive up to \$200 each.

Special consideration also applies for children residing in care services, as well as temporary or provisional visa holders, undocumented migrants, or international students.
